

Satellite "D" @ McCarran

McCarran International Airport has debuted its \$125 million expansion project, an 11-gate northeast wing of the D Gates Satellite Concourse that will allow the nation's sixth-busiest airport to handle approximately 3.1 million more passengers per year.

Its appearance incorporates design elements from the first phase of the Satellite D project, including exposed steel trusses, a curved roof, natural daylight, and thematic images of the Las Vegas Strip.

Clark County Department of Aviation and the Clark County School District to devised a program for incorporating children's artwork into the terminal. Local middle school students participated in a paper airplane competition. Twelve winners were selected to have their planes replicated in a sculpture that will be suspended from the vaulted ceiling of the buildings' northeast wing.

we have a good chance at. In addition, Tenant Improvement and mall stores that bid constantly are our core competency and help keep our core people busy.

Having said this, our opportunities are many and our future is bright. We look forward to another prosperous year here at MHBS. Our hope is that we will be able to share those opportunities with each of you.
